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From a Legal Perspective

Day One, Month One, and Year One Under the Trump Administration

With the advent of the Trump Administration, there was great speculation about what would happen on day one, month one, and year one for energy resources. As messaged in his inaugural speech, and through Inaugural Day Executive Orders, it is clear that President Donald Trump intends to improve our Nation's ability to access and produce energy resources, from leasing and development, to transportation and refining, to energy heating Americans' homes and powering their businesses.

While he started with a series of Executive Orders, the underlying message within these orders is for lasting, durable, defensible change in law and agency regulation. With this second Trump Administration, it is evident that the underlying goal of the Executive Orders is for existing orders, rules and regulations promulgated under the Biden and other administrations are rescinded and replaced with lasting laws and rulemakings following a defensible public process.

On January 20, 2025, President Trump signed multiple Executive Orders directing the Executive Branch to look for ways to reduce administrative and regulatory burdens on energy development, including:

- Declaring a National Energy Emergency, calling on government agencies to streamline approval processes and reduce burdens on our ability to improve our Nation's energy grid and provide reliable energy;
- Unleashing American Energy, encouraging energy exploration and production on federal lands and waters;
- Unleashing Alaska's Extraordinary Resource Potential, ordering the executive departments to rescind and replace, according to the law, all of the restrictive rulemakings and policies placed on developing Alaska's energy resources;
- Temporary Withdrawal of all Areas on the Outer Continental Shelf from Offshore Wind Leasing and Review of the Federal Government's Leasing and Permitting Practices for Wind Projects, pausing offshore wind leases to ensure such leasing is consistent with other uses of the waters, is protective of marine life, and to promote reliable energy generation.

Each of these day one Executive Orders, while not immediately changing law or regulation, provides guidance to the federal executive departments to reduce the regulatory burden on reliable energy for the Nation, including providing reliable transportation for energy resources.

In the coming months, the Trump Administration will be reviewing burdensome policies and moving forward with drafting and initiating new rulemakings to promote lasting energy development laws and regulations, and to support energy infrastructure.

While new legislation and rulemakings take time to effectuate, the results should be durable change.

It is an urban tour of the city, race through Downtown, the Stadium, and Rivers. Another option is the 26.2 mile Marathon Relay. Relay teams are made up of 5 members, each taking their own section of our marathon course. The most popular race is the Half Marathon, 13.1 miles. It is only one of two races to run through the Denver Zoo! For those looking for more than 5K, but not quite a half marathon, there is the Urban 10-Miler also on Sunday May 18th. This race starts at Rocky Mountain College of Art & Design and ends at City Park.
