COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD



This year's Community Service Award Winner, Bresee Carlson, is known by all to have an unprecedented passion and excitement for whatever she decides to involve herself in. Whether it's capturing the attention of students on Western Colorado University's campus, or engaging with a group of Landmen at a DAPL luncheon, Carlson is always pursuing ways to give back to her community. Over the past couple of years, she has taken on new roles to balance on top of an already demanding position as a Partner at Kuiper Law Firm. Since September of 2020 she has been an Adjunct Professor of Oil and Gas Law at Western Colorado University (WCU). That same month she became a Board Member for the Colorado chapter of *Energy Strong*, a grass roots movement whose mission it is to unify blue and white-collar workers throughout the oil and gas industry in the state. Carlson also plays a key role in the DAPL as the Education Committee Co-chair. She works tirelessly to set up monthly DAPL luncheons and manage DAPL members' industry certifications, among other responsibilities. It's this balancing act of voluntary efforts that makes her a well-worthy recipient of this year's Community Service Award.

While Carlson's community involvement casts a wide net, it must be noted that many of the activities that Carlson chooses to involve herself in are primarily for the benefit of the Land side of the oil and gas industry. While not being a Landman by training or occupation, she dedicates herself to serving the Land community through her knowledge of oil and gas law and care for the people who those laws affect. With the thousands of combined members of Energy Strong and the DAPL, as well as the dozens of students in WCU's Energy Management program, her extracurricular efforts permeate deep into the oil and gas community. It's not simply the large number of activities that Carlson chooses involve herself in that is so impressive, but the degree to which each activity affects the improvement of her community. Bresee's commitment to a cause that needs proud and well-informed voices such as hers makes her the clear-cut choice as the winner of the 2021 DAPL Community Service Award.



EDUCATION AWARD



This year's Education Award Winner, Crosby Garrison, has made her mark early in her young career. Hailing from Springfield, MO, she became interested in the energy industry in high school. During her senior year, she was already advancing her own education in the industry by taking an internship with the City Utility Company of Springfield. In the Fall of 2015, she enrolled at the University of Tulsa, where she graduated in 2019 with a double major in Energy Management and Economics. During her curriculum at Tulsa, she had three summer internships, the first two with Newfield Exploration and the third with Anadarko Petroleum Corporation, where she was later hired full-time as a Landman upon graduation. Shortly after accepting the role with Anadarko, the company was purchased by Occidental Petroleum Corporation, where Garrison continues to be employed as a Land Negotiator. She has clearly dedicated herself to education from the on-set of her professional life, which is one of many reasons for her being honored today.

It didn't take long for Garrison to get involved with giving back to the Denver Land community. As soon as she started her career with Anadarko she began attending DAPL educational events and happy hours, which quickly evolved into her current role as the Education Committee Co-Chair. Her gregarious attitude and natural charisma made her a perfect candidate for organizing educational events. Organizing these events is no simple task and takes a breadth of skills to accomplish. From selecting and vetting candidates to present, securing locations to hold the events, and managing registration, Garrison is constantly putting in extra work to make sure the events go as smoothly as possible. On top of that, she came into her current role with the DAPL in the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, which further complicated her essential responsibilities. Through creative planning and a knack for online marketing, she was able to introduce the summer webinar series in-lieu of in-person luncheons during the summer of 2020. Garrison also maintains the DAPL's LinkedIn profile, which proved critical for putting information at the fingertips of DAPL members when face-to-face dissemination of information was challenging at best.

It's events like the Fall Land Institute that showcase the culmination of the Garrison's efforts. Known as one of the top educational events that the DAPL offers each year, it was certainly no easy feat to put together the impressive group of speakers on a number of salient topics, from an "Energy Case Law Update" for the state of Texas to a "Blockchain Applications for AFE Joint Venture Billing" presentation. In total, the event had seven unique presentations with ten separate speakers, which took countless hours too coordinate in the months leading up to the event.



Garrison has made an impact by furthering the education of the Denver Land community early in her career. While we know there are certainly great accomplishments that lay in her future, her efforts thus far deserve to be recognized. HALL OF FAME AWARD



The 2021 Hall of Fame Award Winner, John Hasche, was born and raised in Glendive, Montana. He graduated in 1974 from University of Montana with a degree in Geography. The same year, he began career in Denver with Amoco Production Company, putting his undergraduate skills to use in their map drafting department. In 1976 he made the move to the land department at Amoco, and there was no looking back from there. Throughout his prosperous career, he was a Landman and manager for Amoco, Western Gas Resources, Inc. and Anadarko Petroleum Corporation, where he worked various assets in the Rockies region. Now partially retired, Hasche is still an active member of the Denver Land community. Hasche is heavily involved in mentoring the younger generation of up-and-coming Land professionals. Since the inception of Western Colorado University's (WCU) Energy

Management program in the mid-2000s, Hasche has facilitated countless partnerships between industry professionals, energy educators, and students. He has served as a Member on the WCU Advisory Board since 2008. His time and resources spent on the development of this program and spreading land education while at the height of his career at Anadarko and afterward are invaluable. Since then, he has spent countless hours mentoring students from WCU and young industry professionals in Denver interested in energy and land-based careers.

Hasche's experience in the Rockies region exposed him to managing assets in a variety of basins. While at Amoco, he oversaw much of the land operations in the San Juan Basin. In this role, he managed a multi-discipline team of engineers, land negotiators, and land administrators. He also led Amoco's successful defense in the Southern Ute Reservation litigation, valued at saving up to \$500 million in settlement costs. He left Amoco in 1999 after the merger with BP. In 2006, Hasche joined Anadarko where he worked as a Senior Staff Landman and Land Project Advisor until the merger with Oxy in 2019. During his tenure at Anadarko, he managed assets in both the Greater Green River Basin and the DJ Basin, where he became a subject matter expert on the Union Pacific Land Grant mineral ownership.

Hasche is also active in giving back to the Denver land community through the DAPL. He was president of the DAPL from 2009-10 and spent many years as the Education Committee Co-Chair. He is currently a mentor in the John L. Hunt Mentorship Program, a DAPL sponsored group that links young land professionals just starting their careers with older more experienced industry veterans such as himself. The mentorship program is just one of many ways that he continues to come up with new ideas to give back through his achievements. For over forty years, he has been a pillar of leadership in the Denver Land community.

When he is not keeping busy with his many philanthropic pursuits, Hasche enjoys spending time at his second home in Gunnison with his wife Kitty, golfing, shotgun shooting, fly fishing/tying, and cowboy movies (particularly those with John Wayne).

LANDMAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

The 2021 Landman of the Year is someone who represents the oil and gas industry in a proud and progressive way. This awardee is passionate about volunteering her time and energy into the oil and gas industry and the Denver community as a whole. She has been on the DAPL Board since 2014 and her impact reaches far and wide. The 2021 Landman of the Year has been involved in the DAPL Networking and Ethics Committee and has served as the Secretary and Vice President of DAPL, just to name a few of her contributions. She is also an integral part of the DAPL sponsorship program and is always volunteering her time to maintain relationships with our sponsors. Not only is this Landman a huge part of the behind the scenes work at the DAPL, she has also given meaningful educational presentations at events like FLI.



Although the past year has been anything but normal, this awardee's drive in her career has remained unchanged. This Landman is a CPL and is one of the best in the industry. As Land Manager of both the Texas and New Mexico assets at her company, she oversees approximately 47,000 net acres. This Landman tends to 49 vertical wells, 15 DUCs, 24 horizontal wells in the Midland and 1,200 producing wells in the Delaware basin. Not only does her job require continual maintenance of these existing wells, but she is also responsible for staying ahead of her company's two rig drilling and completion program. This deserving awardee is known for her commitment to excellence in her career, but also known for maintaining quality relationships with everyone that has the honor to work with her. Her company and co-workers are grateful for all the ground that she covers on a day-to-day basis, and they truly value her drive and commitment to the success of the company.

As many of you know, the 2021 Landman of the year is highly regarded by all of her colleagues for passionately standing behind the oil and gas industry in the face of opposition, which is especially difficult (and common) in the Colorado Energy Industry. She's also exceedingly philanthropic, frequently volunteering her time and talent to various organizations within the community. She's been an advocate for the oil & gas business by giving presentations to law firms and schools and served as liaison to the Latino community through roles with Latino organizations. This awardee also volunteers as a court-appointed special advocate children in the dependency and neglect system. She donates hundreds of hours to her community outside of the oil and gas industry and acts as a mentor to people in the industry. The scope of this Landman's impact is so wide and the DAPL is truly indebted to her.
